Bulldogs Return From Road Trip With Three More Games Won

DEFEAT HURONS, LANSING BUS. UNIVERSITY, MICH. STATE FROSH

The Ferris Institute cagers arrived home Saturday night with three more victories to their credit, after having defeated Mich. Normal at Ypsilanti, Lansing Business U., and the Michigan State Frosh on Thursday, Friday and Saturday respectively.

The Ypsi game was by far the stiffest contest of the three. Ferris was not favored to win, but after a grueling contest in which the lead changed sides several times, the Bulldogs finally emerged victorious with a 200-point lead, 27-26. A free throw by Schaur decided the game.

Although the Huron scorers had amassed a total of 17 points in the first half, Ferris was leading at the end of the period with 18. Kaslasky was one of the highlights of the game, turning in 14 points for his mates in the first half; he was held to one basket in the final period but added a free throw to raise his total to 17 points for the game, which made his season's scoring total 115. For Ferris, Schaur led the scoring with 10 points, while Shankland and Nelson followed with seven each.

Coch McElwain started the season against Lansing Business University Friday night, in a fairly slow game which Ferris won 28-14.

The game was played by quarters. Lansing led the Bulldogs 4-2 at the end of the first quarter, and Coach Mac put in the regulars who completely stopped their opponents and ran their own score up until they were leading 9-4 at the half. The end of the third period found the score 24-10 for Ferris.

Peck led the scoring for Lansing with six points, two goals and two baskets. For Ferris, Shankland and Nelson turned in six points each to head the list.

The Michigan State Frosh, whom the Bulldogs played Saturday at Ypsilanti in the last game on their trip, were not as strong as had been anticipated and Ferris won 15-16.

Statistics reveal that while the Frosh actually made more baskets than the Bulldogs, they lost the game on the larger number of fouls charged against them and their inability to score so many points with their own free throws.

Vadvik made the most points for the Frosh by landing three goals. The scoring was quite evenly divided among the Ferris squad, Nelson, Shankland and Schaur making four points each.
