Author, child abuse expert to speak at Ferris

BIG RAPIDS – Author and professional speaker Sue William Silverman will read from her work at 7:30 p.m. on March 22 in the Founders' Room in the Rankin Student Center on Ferris State University's Big Rapids campus. As an expert on issues regarding family dynamics, child abuse and addiction, Silverman has appeared on many nationally-syndicated radio and TV programs including "Anderson Cooper 360," "Montel Williams Show," "Ricki Lake Show," CNN-Headline News, a John Stossel special, and both the United States and Canadian Discovery Channels.

Silverman is the author of the memoirs *Because I Remember Terror*, *Father*, *I Remember You* and *Love Sick: One Woman's Journey Through Sexual Addiction*. Her works have been translated into Japanese, Chinese, Norwegian and German. For her work in literature and child abuse victim advocacy, Aquinas College awarded her an honorary doctorate in humane letters.

In reviewing *Because I Remember Terror*, the *St. Petersburg Times* wrote, "Silverman's lyric style transforms a ravaged childhood into a work of art." Best-selling author Deborah Tannen said that *Love Sick* "sheds light on a topic that has been shrouded in secrecy and muddled in misperceptions."
