# Candidates Compete for Title of Homecoming King and Queen at Ferris

BIG RAPIDS – Four women and three men will vie for the titles of Ferris State University Homecoming King and Queen.

Ferris will celebrate Homecoming 2013 with a "Bulldog Beach Bash" of activities that begin Monday, Sept. 30 and wrap up Saturday, Oct. 5 with a parade, alumni events and a football game. The king and queen will be crowned during halftime of the game by 2012 King Byron Williams and Queen Avery Larson.

The candidates make up a "very outgoing and professional group," said Steve Balkema, chairman of the selection committee. "Each of them has demonstrated leadership qualities, and they are all very involved on campus. They all have immense Ferris pride as well."

The university's king and queen are charged with fostering friendship, togetherness and professionalism among Ferris students, Balkema said.

Voting will begin at 8 a.m. Wednesday, Oct. 2 and continue through 11 p.m. Thursday, Oct. 3 on

In addition to their individual campaigns, the candidates will attend several events during homecoming week, including the lip sync competition and King and Queen Q&A Session at 7 p.m. Monday, Sept. 30 in Williams Auditorium. Other homecoming events include the kickball tournament at 7 p.m. Tuesday, Oct. 1 at Top Taggart Field, the bonfire at 8 p.m. Wednesday, Oct. 2 in Lot 61 behind Brophy/McNerney residence halls and a performance by a comedian at 7 p.m. Thursday, Oct. 3 in Williams Auditorium.

The homecoming parade will begin at noon Saturday, Oct. 5 in downtown Big Rapids, followed by the football game at 2 p.m. at Top Taggart Field, which pits the Bulldogs against the Saginaw Valley Cardinals.

To run for king or queen, candidates must be a full-time student and have a cumulative GPA of 2.5 or higher. They also must be involved in an extra-curricular activity affiliated with the university and must be sponsored by two registered student organizations. Candidates also must have a campaign manager who is a full-time student.

Potential candidates completed an application process and were interviewed by homecoming committee advisors and members, students from different colleges and faculty and staff members.
