The low vision patient faces many obstacles in everyday life. Whether the reduced vision occurs at birth or later in life, the individual must adapt both physically and psychologically. Like any other person with a disability or handicap, there are several resources of help for the low vision patient. Certainly, no single professional can provide all aspects of treatment, and the patient must determine what rehabilitative service will be most helpful. The role of the optometrist is to prescribe low vision aids, provide instruction to insure proper use of these aids, and appropriate referral to other rehabilitative specialists if necessary so that the low vision patient can enjoy participation in everyday activities.

The optometrist providing low vision services must constantly be changing examination procedures to adapt to each patient's wants and needs. A strong doctor-patient relationship must be established. The optometrist must take an extensive case history and be a careful observer and listener. It is up to the optometrist to help the patient realize their full visual potential, and inform the patient if they have unrealistic expectations of regaining or keeping their useful vision.

While taking a case history, the examiner must be aware of any specifically stated interests of the patient. If the patient has a specific task for their vision and not limited by their visual acuity, the examiner can try to prescribe an aid that satisfies the need for the specific task. Patients with a specific task requirement generally do not require a lengthy training period. If the patient can not recall specific interests in the initial history, the examiner should perform the vision evaluation and still present low vision aids. Then in going over the aids, the examiner can review a list of activities with the patient. It is important to ask the patient what they would like to be able to do. This way, the examiner can work with the patient and recommend aids while practicing the activities that are important to the patient.

The purpose of this project is to put together near point items that an individual is exposed to in everyday life. The items in the manual will have the print size next to it so that no guessing will be necessary. If a low vision patient has a specific near point task that they wish to see, an example of the task will be present in the manual. Having the near task in front of the patient will also avoid over or under prescribing an aid for a specific near point task.

tell him now that I don't want to go."

So Mrs. Jim Ragland, our school principal's wife, and I got into the army car and took off. It was scary. There had been a lot of sniping, and there was nobody else in the streets as the car moved quickly to avoid rifle fire from the rooftops. At the last checkpoint in West Beirut, we had to cross a four-block stretch of no-man's-land.

My first thought on entering East Beirut that day was that I hated the idea of leaving the country from that side. Sometimes when I love something and it's taken away from me, I don't want anything else. Nothing else is right. I wanted to be in West Beirut—or gone from Lebanon.

The fighting of the past few weeks had been different. Many times before we had been caught in fights because one militia was in conflict with another. The Hizballah, Amal, Druze, Shi'ites and Sunnis had all fought each other at one time or another. But this time, all the parties were fighting against Amal. My sixth floor apartment, just a block from the school, was situated between

Druze and Amal militias shooting at each other. The gunmen were firing back and forth without even seeing where they were shooting. Sometimes they would put their machine guns over the side of the roof and just spray! In the last days before I left, they hit five different glass doors of my apartment. I had replaced these doors four times before from the fighting, and now, here they were, crumbled again.

The first two nights of the fighting I'd moved my sofa into the hall and stayed there because that meant there was an outside room all around. If any rocket-propelled grenades came in, they would explode in one of the outside rooms. I'd seen what happens when the shrapnel from those RPGs hits a room. You learn not to trust your walls. After a couple of days, when the fighting became heavier than ever before, I couldn't get back to my apartment so I stayed with Mrs. Ragland at the school compound. Leola and her husband, Jim, had left for the East Side two weeks before, but she had come back to pack their things. The Ameri-

can Embassy had insisted that Jim leave West Beirut because of the threat of kidnapping to American men.

With Jim's departure, I was left to run the school, which was difficult. I am an English teacher and not used to directing 940 students. They had seen the photos in the weekend papers of Dr. Ragland leaving and they were in shock. When they came to school on Monday I spoke to the older ones in chapel and told them that my father—who was a Baptist pastor in Texas for 50 years—always said that if a pastor leaves a church and the church falls apart, it means that he wasn't a very good pastor. So I told them that now it was up to them to show what a good director he had been, to demonstrate the respect he had always taught.

You have to understand how important education is to the people of Lebanon. Seventy percent of our students are Muslim and only 30 percent Christian. The Muslims are determined to come to our school, even though everyone must study the Bible and go to chapel. Every spring parents come and

MOST SO-CALLED getaway islands

boast an individual central character, their cherished lodestar. If you return from your vacation without having met that person, acquaintances who have preceded you are likely to express some skepticism about whether you've actually been there.

On tiny Green Turtle Cay — one of a string of the Abaco islands that form the northernmost chain of the Bahamas — such a star is Miss Emily Cooper.

Miss Emily boasts of making the greatest Goombay Smash in the islands, and everyone who walks through the doors of her garishly blue-painted establishment is expected to partake of one.

Obstinately, she refuses to give away the recipe, though elsewhere in the Bahamas, it is no secret that the Smash is made of a concoction of normal rum and coconut

rum, lime juice, egg white and pineapple juice topped with a maraschino cherry.

BUT THE popularity of Miss Emily's Blue Bee Bar is attested to by the fact that the walls and ceiling are covered with mementos of her callers — business cards, photographs, dollar bills, expired credit cards and drivers' licenses. 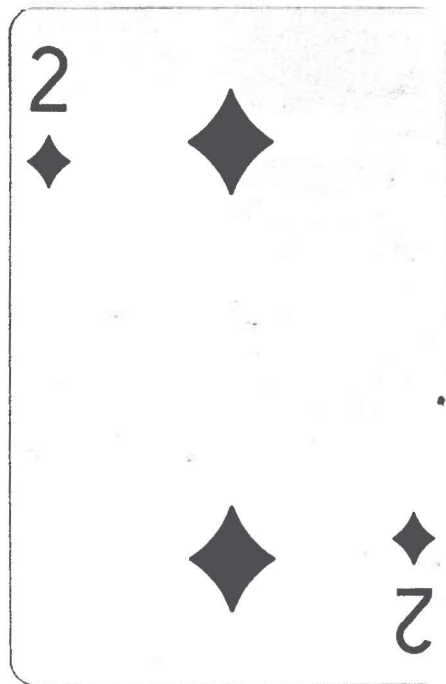

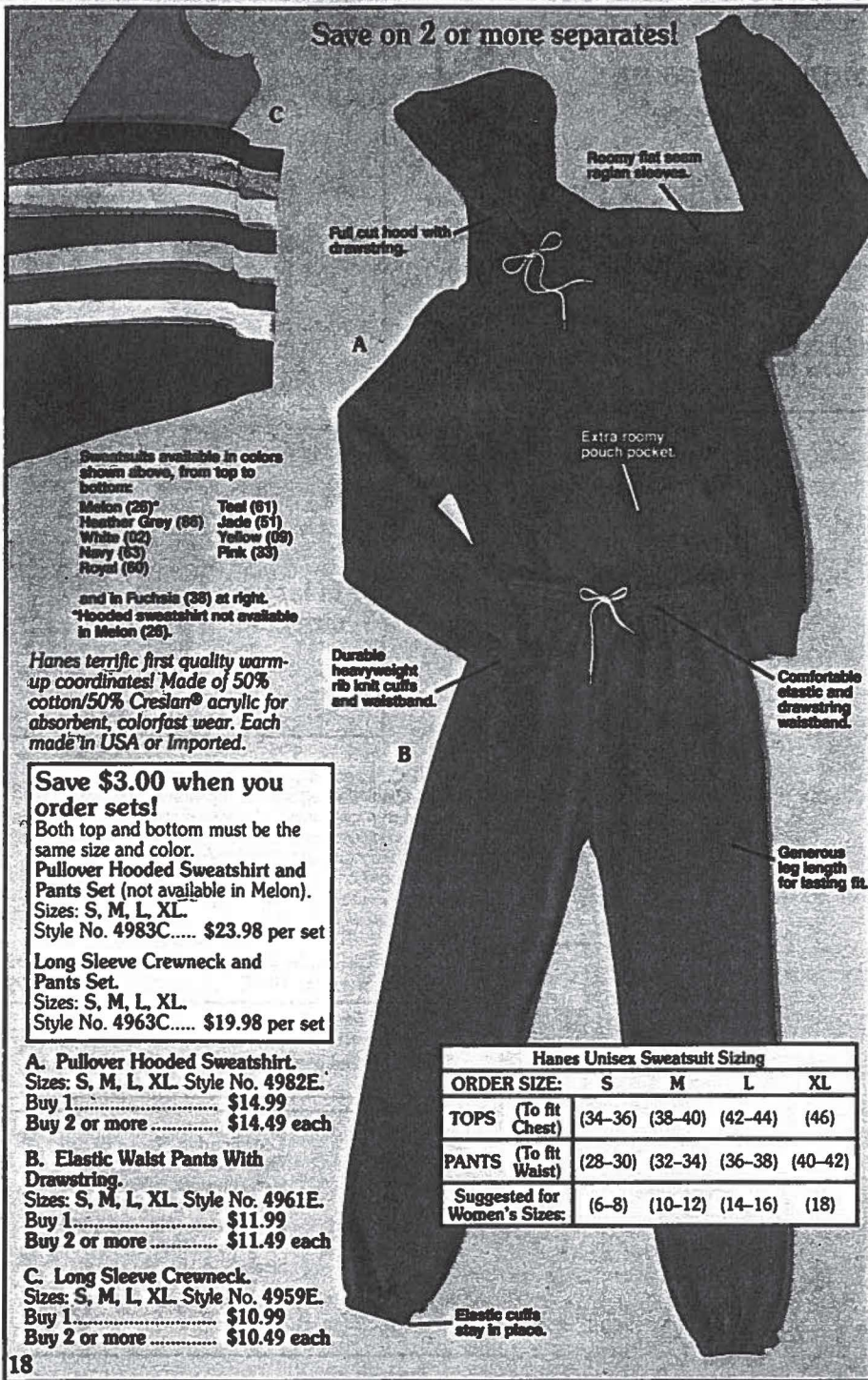
