Finding Summer Employment with a Michigan Ophthalmologist: A Practical Guide for Optometry Students

ABSTRACT

The main purpose of this project was to develop an employment guide for optometry students interested in summer employment with Michigan opthalmologists. To achieve this goal, a questionnaire was developed and mailed to 259 ophthalmology practices in Michigan.

Twenty-one questionnaires (8.1%) were returned. Many came from the Detroit area (42.9%) and expressed an interest in hiring optometry students as ophthalmic technicians (60.0%). In all, there were 30 positions that were appropriate for optometry students and two for licensed optometrists. The Michigan College of Optometry Employment Guide contains information about each position and is available to interested optometry students.

INTRODUCTION

Every Spring, thousands of college students across the United States begin their quest for summer employment. In their enthusiasm, many fail to realize how difficult it can be to find the "perfect" job. Employment agencies, job placement centers and newspapers ads as well as family and friends play an important role in easing this burden. Students of optometry face this difficulty as well. In addition, they must meet the unique challenge of finding summer employment with an optometrist or ophthalmologist. In 1997, a list of Michigan optometrists was compiled to assist students in their search for summer employment. The intent of this project was to develop a supplemental employment guide of Michigan ophthalmologists who would be interested in hiring optometry students as well. To achieve this goal, more than 250 questionnaires were mailed to ophthalmologists within the State of Michigan.

METHODS

Questionnaires, like other forms of written communication, must be clear, meaningful, concise and appeal to the interests of the reader. They must also achieve their primary purpose of gathering information that can be analyzed and used to form logical conclusions. The actual design of the survey is limited only by the creative abilities of the designer-writer. Clearly, certain

designs are more effective than others in achieving specific goals. Therefore, it is important for the survey designer to understand the objectives of the questionnaire.

Designing the Survey Questionnaire

The first goal of the employment questionnaire was to capture the reader's attention and explain the purpose of the questionnaire. To achieve this goal, the survey's opening statement (see Appendix A) offers ophthalmologists the opportunity to place a free help wanted ad in the Michigan College of Optometry Employment Guide. The statement is clear, meaningful and concise, and presents an offer that appeals to an ophthalmologist who has an opening in his or her practice. The next paragraph of the survey describes the Michigan College of Optometry Employment Guide as a "unique and valuable resource available to first and second year optometry students interested in obtaining summer employment". Thus, when the two opening statements of the questionnaire are taken together they not only spark the reader's interest but also familiarize the reader with the purpose of the survey.

The second goal of the questionnaire was to inform the reader of the important benefits of employing optometry students. It was an important design concept to highlight this part of the questionnaire and make it look like the "Experience" portion of a business resume. To achieve this goal, the survey incorporates a section titled "How Your Practice Benefits" (see Appendix A). In the survey, this title appears in bold-face type and is underlined for emphasis. Each descriptive statement that follows is preceeded by a round, bold-face bullet, creating the familiar look and feel of a professional business resume.

The final goal of the questionnaire was to solicit information about potential employment opportunities. A separate portion of the survey, "Employment Opportunities", achieves this goal (see Appendix A). It's design allows the reader to choose from a list of three employment positions listed on the questionnaire and/or to specify other positions which were not included on the survey. This section also includes a number of questions about time commitment, desired experience and/or skills, and the practice's history of employing optometry students.

Printing the Survey Questionnaire

Once the design of the questionnaire was finalized several companies were contacted for printing estimates. Each company was asked to provide a price quote over the phone for 275 trifolded copies of a one-page, single-sided document on gray 20 lb. bond paper. Even though 275 copies were requested, the print shops supplied quotes for 500 copies, which is an industry standard for larger orders. The estimates ranged in price from \$17.50 (Office Depot) to \$49.00 (Allegra Print and Imaging). Kinko's provided an estimate of \$31.00, while Printing Paradigms said the job could be done for \$38.00. None of the estimates included Michigan sales tax. Since Office Depot provided the most reasonable quote they were chosen for the job. Their final estimate for 275 copies was \$13.75 plus tax. Their print department used two original documents to produce the questionnaires and completed the entire job in one day for the estimated amount.

Developing the Mailing List

Three sources of data were considered in the development of the mailing list for the project. They were The American Academy of Ophthalmology 1997-1998 Member Directory, the print version of the Yellow Pages, and the internet Yellow Pages. For several reasons, the member directory was an inadequate source for the development of an ophthalmology mailing list: the directory is a printed document that is not readily converted to a computorized mailing list; the directory contains hundreds of names of ophthalmology faculty, retired ophthalmologists and resident opthalmologists which are useless for this kind of project (see Appendix B). The print version of the Yellow Pages proved inadequate because, like the directory, it is a printed document of names and addresses that is not readily transformed into a computorized mailing list. The internet Yellow Pages is by far the best source of data for developing a mailing list of ophthalmologists. The list for this project was created for all ophthalmologists in the State of Michigan (see Appendix C). Addresses were extracted from the internet browser using a copy and paste methodology. Displayed information was selected by using a mouse to highlight the information, pressing Ctrl-C to copy the information to the Windows Clipboard, switching to an open Microsoft Word 97 document and pressing Ctrl-V to paste the information into the word

document (see Appendix D). Once all the information was extracted and saved to a Microsoft Word (.doc) file document the file was edited to remove extraneous data. All occurences of the words "map" and "driving instructions" were removed from the document using Edit/Replace (see Appendix E). The Word document then had to be converted to a format that was readable by computer programs. So the Word document was saved as a Text Only (.txt) file. This intermediate text file now needed to be converted to an ASCII comma delimited file that would ultimately be imported into an ACT! 3.0. A small program was written to read the file (three text lines per practice), extract and organize the data into a one line ASCII comma delimited record that was written to a file that would be imported into ACT! Input Format

Output Format

"Adams James L MD", "4870 West Clark Road", "Ypsilanti", "MI", "48197", "734-434-0404"

(see Appendix E). The ASCII comma delimited file from the previous step was then imported into ACT! 3.0, a contact manager database. The database was sorted into practice name and street address order. All duplicate name and address records were removed. The database was then sorted into phone number order and all duplicate records were removed. The final database or mailing list contained 259 records or listings, each with a unique name, street address, and phone number (see Appendix F).

Generating Printed Labels and Mailing the Ouestionnaires

The mailing list and label printing software made it easy to generate printed mailing labels. The names and addresses of each ophthalmology practice were printed on 2" x 4" adhesive labels (see Appendix G) which were then attached to white #10 envelopes along with first class postage.

Next, a trifolded survey questionnaire and white #9 self-addressed envelope were inserted into each #10 envelope. Then the #10 envelopes were sealed and mailed through the U. S. Post Office.

Project Expenses

The printing and mailing portions of the project were relatively inexpensive. Many of the supplies, including the mailing labels, return labels and #9 envelopes, were donated (see Acknowledgments). It cost \$14.58 to print and trifold 275 questionnaires. Postage was the greatest expense, costing \$85.47 for 259 first class stamps. A box of 500 white #10 envelopes was purchased for an additional \$4.23. So, the total out-of-pocket expense for the project was \$104.28.

RESULTS

Number and Location

It did not take long for the first completed questionnaires to be returned, and after approximately two months a total of 21 surveys (8.1%) had been received. Sixteen cities across lower Michigan were represented among the returned questionnaires. The cities ranged from Traverse City and East Pointe in the north and east, respectively, to St. Joseph in the southwest. The bulk of the surveys (42.9%) came from the greater Detroit area. Two surveys were received from different ophthalmology practices in each of the following cities: East Pointe, Flint, Southfield, Traverse City and West Bloomfield.

Available Positions

The questionnaires revealed a total of 30 potentially available positions for optometry students. In addition, two ophthalmology practices expressed their interest in hiring a licensed optometrist. Most (60.0%) of the positions available to optometry students were for ophthalmic technicians. Other positions were for contact lens dispensers (20.0%), opticians (16.7%) and an optometric technician (3.3%).

Time Commitment

Eight (38.1%) of the 21 practices indicated an interest in hiring full-time help. Three others (14.3%) said their positions were part-time. In 28.6% of the questionnaires the respondants

checked both boxes for full- and part-time employment. Other responses to the time commitment question included "flexible" (3.3%), "either" (6.7%) and "part-time, possible full-time" (3.3%). History of Employing Students

Ten (47.6%) of the 21 survey responants said they had hired optometry students before. Of these, the vast majority (90.0%) had previously employed students as ophthalmic technicians. (The remaining 10.0% did not specify a position of employment.) Most (70.0%) were in group practices. All others (30.0%) were solo practicioners.

Practice Mode and Staff Optometrist

Twelve (57.1%) of the 21 surveys were from group practices. Two (9.5%) were partnersips and seven (33.3%) were solo practices. The vast majority (75.0%) of the group practices had an optometrist on staff. One (50.0%) of the partnerships employed an optometrist, while only two (28.6%) of the solo practices had an optometrist on staff. In all, 57.1% of the respondants had optometrists at their practices.

Experience and/or Skills

The survey responders most frequently specified a desire for the following skills: entrance testing (history, visual acuity, extraocular motilities, and pupil evaluation), tonometry, and refraction. One or more of these skills was hand-written on nine (42.9%) of the questionnaires. They were implied on at least three (14.3%) other surveys because two respondants circled the "How Your Practice Benefits" section of the survey to answer the experience/skills question and another individual wrote "general optometric or equivalent of certified ophthalmic assistant" as her answer. In all, the three skills listed above were desired by at least 57.2% of the survey respondants. Seven (28.6%) individuals did not respond to the experience/skills question. Other less frequent responses included slit lamp, retinoscopy, external exam, lensometry and frame adjustment.

Summary and Conclusion

The main purpose of this project was to develop an employment resource for optometry students interested in summer employment with Michigan ophthalmologists. To achieve this goal, a survey

questionnaire was developed and mailed to 259 ophthalmology practices in Michigan. Twentyone completed questionnaires (8.1%) were returned. They identified 30 different positions
available to optometry students. Most (60.0%) of the available postions were for ophthalmic
technicians. Many of the positions (38.1%) were for full-time employment. Nearly half of the
respondants (47.6%) had hired optometry students previously. The most desired skills were
entrance testing, tonometry and refraction. Clearly, optometry students who are interested in this
type of experience can find it with a variety of Michigan ophthalmologists. The employment
guide that accompanies this paper identifies more than 20 Michigan ophthalmology practices that
would like to hire optometry students. By using this resource, students will find it easier to obtain
a "perfect" summer job.


