1. Recommendations for the Graduation Ceremony – Mike Cairns and Jacque Hooper

Deans' Council discussed the recommendations for the graduation ceremony developed by Jacque Hooper and Mike Cairns, as outlined in their February 25 e-mail. After discussion, the deans agreed to the following:

- Colleges are responsible for organizing graduates by degrees (associate, bachelors, masters)
- Adjutant cards will be printed with name, type of program completed (e.g. hospitality management), and Latin honor, if any
- Mike Cairns and Jacque Hooper will consider whether a more formal exit from the auditorium could occur for faculty and administration.

Mike Cairns distributed copies of the depiction of new graduation banners designed by AI Williams.

2. Articulation Agreements

Deans were reminded to update articulation agreements regularly. It was suggested that the Articulation Office make a regular routine of meeting with the various colleges to update the agreements, as well as develop a standardized procedure.

3. Other

Laurie Chesley reminded the deans of the Faculty Recognition Dinner scheduled for April 22. This year's theme is "Springtime in Paris."

Laurie Chesley also noted that a White Paper on a review of student evaluation research is being distributed to faculty and academic administrators. The research was compiled

by Terry Doyle. The White Paper is meant to evoke discussion at forums to be scheduled in the near future.

The College of Technology recently sponsored a cross disciplinary team in the regional Rube Goldberg machine competition at MSU. The FSU team won the competition and will be going to Purdue University for the national finals. The winner of the national finals will appear on the David Letterman show.
