Agenda Items:

- 1) **Dean's Updates:** Updates were briefly presented, with the updates being sent via e-mail prior to the *Librarians' Meeting* so as to leave time for other agenda items. Refer to *Appendix A: Dean's Updates*.
- 2) Report on Microfilm Project (Leah): Leah reported that they have started to weed the patent cassettes. 13 drawers have been emptied. Myrna is helping with shifting to consolidate the film and the fiche. The empty bottom drawers in the wall units will be used with the shifting project, and it is hoped that all contents can be shifted from the free-standing floor units to the wall units.
- 3) Report on Driving-tests.org (Leah): See Appendix B for information about this online resource which includes practice exams. Discussion ensued regarding desirability of linking to Driving-tests.org since there are pop-ups, and also regarding where this resource would be placed. It was determined that this product should be linked from FLITE and that a practical placement for this resource would be under the Database Access by Subject page, under a newly created category called Online Practice Exams. The Online Practice exams category would contain other links such as to LearningExpress Library and other resources which include practice tests for national exams, such as PharmacyLibrary.
- 4) **Update on listening stations** (Mari): Melinda and Mari have been working on this project and have been discussing what would be optimal for the listening stations. They would like to accommodate multiple listening formats, including CDs, LPs, cassettes, and MP3. They are also interested in having VHS available. They are hoping to have headphones at check-out as well, and have access to splitters to allow 2 people to listen at the same time. Mary has talked to other schools for information on equipment and pricing options, and it is hoped that equipment can be secured for 2 listening stations. The need for a use policy, like for computers, was discussed; as LPs in particular can be easily damaged. Also the need for an LP cleaner was mentioned. Scott indicated that unequivocally they will pay for this project.
- 5) Index and Abstract subscription discussion (Fran): Further information on this inquiry can be found in Appendix C. Briefly, Fran was wondering if in the future we should consider discontinuing Index and Abstract databases that do not also contain the full text, and invest more heavily in full text, with the presumption that Discovery services will get better. Discussion ensued with concerns that general databases serve a different purpose than subject databases, and that Discovery services are not yet to the point that this would be practical or desirable.

- 6) Mango Languages subscription discussion (Fran): See Appendix C for more details. Fran was wondering if the library should consider subscribing to Mango, an online resource that supports foreign language learning. Suggestions including partnering with the Languages and Literature Department to determine the need for and utility of this resource, and also exploring free resources that are similar in nature. Kristy indicated that programs with a strong foreign language component may very much benefit from this type of resource. Fran indicated that there is a one-time purchase option. Pricing details are found in Appendix C.

I thought I had forwarded this info to everyone previously, but I think maybe I'm remembering forwarding it to Melinda for discussion. Driving-tests.org has been marketing itself pretty heavily to various types of libraries, and they recently started a promotion aimed at university libraries. They had a booth at ALA Midwinter, and they also plan to be in San Francisco this summer. ERG would like some input from the librarians at large about whether it would be appropriate to put a link to this web site on our own web site. Since a significant percentage of young people are postponing getting their driver's licenses (my daughter and all her high school friends are examples), we thought there might be some value in making a link to practice driving tests available to students. We might put it in a database category that would include LearningExpress and any other online test prep collections we have. ERG had somewhat mixed feelings about the idea (some of that was incomprehension that students aren't getting their licenses earlier), so we would like some broader discussion at the Librarians Meeting. It appears that there are a lot of safety organizations that are helping to sponsor this website, plus there are paid advertisements, so there is no cost associated with linking to the site. I took the first test, and about half way through it made me take a survey about airlines in order to proceed, but once I finished the 10-question survey, I got a popup that told me I could use the site for 7 days survey-free. Maybe that's the price for free, or maybe we don't want to subject students to ads and surveys.
