Kaylia Ervin Bachelor's in Criminal Justice

"I saw college as a way out. I knew I had the brains to do more and I should use my God-given gifts to make a way for myself... Sadly, I am an anomaly of foster youth. Usually youth who spend time in foster care don't go to college. I'm just proud to be here standing on my own two feet. I'm going off to law school. I'm accomplishing goals one little step at a time."

Samantha Fordyce Doctorate in Optometry

"I didn't get a lot of sleep. It was practice, study and sleep. Even in the offseason, we had 5 a.m. practice followed by another hour of conditioning. It's draining, but it's a worthwhile experience. You start to learn what you are capable of when you're a student-athlete. You learn how far you can push yourself and make yourself that much better. It's a really rewarding experience."

Lily Hou Bachelor's in Furniture Design

"I knew very early on that I wanted to study abroad. My parents were very supportive, because they wanted me to experience different cultures and learn new things... It was hard only being able to Skype with my parents every week, but I knew I couldn't feel sorry for myself. My parents wanted me to get a good education, so I knew the most important thing was to make the most out of it and to pay them back by learning a lot here."

"At Ferris I found a place where I fit in and where a grew as a person. I found something I'm really passionate about.
