2. FY05 Budget

Next year will be maximum of 5% - a signicant portion will come from positions and/or supfac dollars. Will try not to eliminate positions currently filled. Still some ability to make changes. Not everyone will be hit equally. May consider VRIPs, less than 7 month retirement requests.

Pres. has asked to bring forward anything on separations – creative ways to assist faculty take the next step in their career. Workload reduction.
