Minutes Ferris State University Academic Senate Meeting

October 4, 2016- 10:00 a.m.

1.	President Thapa called the meeting to order at 10:04 a.m.
2.	Approval of Minutes. Senator Zyla moved to approve the minutes. Senator Bacon seconded. The motion passed.
3.	Open Forum. Senator Marion related part of an incident which lead to his stepping down as the faculty market adjustment pay chair. He was interrupted by President Thapa who ruled he was out of order because this was a union issue and not relevant to the Senate. Senator Marion said he would finish the story after the meeting for any interested individuals.
4.	Officer Reports President Thapa encouraged applicants to apply for the UCC and APRC chair positions and noted that the release time had been changed. IT was now 35% for the UCC chair and 40% for the APRC chair. He discussed the image of Ferris State University and how it has compared in the rankings to places like Grand Valley State University. He also noted changes/clarification should be coming in relation to the APRC process as it relates to minors and certificates.
	Vice-President Bacon reported that the senate should be forming an ad-hoc task force relating to the creation of a graduate school at Ferris.
	Secretary Isler stated the charter ballots would be going out to all faculty by October 10 th .
5.	Committee Reports UCC Chair Kemi Fadayomi demonstrated the electronic version of the Form A. Senator Peircey noted an error in that the Form G was not able to be tabled like the others. Senator Drake asked about the hold function for Academic Affairs. Chair Fadayomi noted that it can be held for pedagogical reasons and it has happened. General Education coordinator Cliff Franklund deferred his report until the action item later in the agenda. Student Government vice president Josh Olszewski reported on the need for increased transparency and meaningful expenses. 7 additional members joined in the last week. There is now a president's council and a RSO spotlight. Senator Alspach asked if the new finance forms were available. Vice-President Olszewski said yes.
6a	Conversations with Senate- Bruce Borkovich, Director of Public Safety. Public Safety director Bruce Borkovich thanked the Senate for the opportunity to give updates. His staff are working on tactical training, using the currently vacant Taggart Hall. They are focusing on the shift in active shooter training. Soon there will be a video about the training available via the website, which is a shift in the say it had been made available in the past. He opened the floor to questions from Senator. Vice-President Bacon asked where the Clery report was. Director Borkovich noted it was in the annual report, and was along with

other information. Bacon noted that Kendall and off campus sites did not include stats which made the report look worse. Borkovich noted that in those instances we are dependent on local police for the information. Vice-Bacon also noted that several classrooms in Science do not have bolted doors and good options for escape. Senator Zyla asked how they handle students who have restraining orders. Borkovich asked that instructors notify the department if they are made aware of a situation. Senator Lewis noted there could be privacy/ FERPA issues involved and suggested that General Counsel be involved in creating a process. Senator Todd noted security issues including theft in the Swan building and asked what needs to be done to reactivate the security system. Director Borkovich suggested that they contact Dean Schult to see about funding for such a project. Senator Gray noted that that cameras are in the University Center and Granger and asked about access. Director Borkovich stated that they have access to the feed and limited staff within the building. John Schmidt noted that the cameras currently on in Granger have been placed not to monitor students and employees and have had minimal effect in being able to identify crime.

7a General Education Assessment Plan

Senator Piercey moved to approve the General Education Assessment Plan. Senator Alspach seconded. Coordinator Franklund summarized his presentation from the retreat, noting that this changes General Education from being based on seat time to outcomes (and use of data for more than just collection). He also described the 6 steps for data collection. Vice-President Bacon had several questions: 1) was this a first reading 2) No online assessment? 3)Is diverging from the 95% completion interval a good choice and 4) this method does not involve access to TracDat? Secretary Isler and Parliamentarian Lewis confirmed this was a motion on the floor. Coordinator Franklund noted that online assessment should be included as part of the model. Coordinator Franklund said this was a science standard for confidence intervals but he was open to changing And he would work with Vice-President Bacon to get access to TracDat. Senator Stone noted that while supporting this proposal, she noted concerns about the inability to de-identify courses taught by one instructor. Dr. Franklund said this was why they created aggregated groups. Senator Maike asked if the categories will be available in TracDat. Dr. Franklund said not at this point, but he would be happy to set them up. Senator Foulk, although supportive of the idea, questioned what constituted a program. Coordinator Franklund said areas such as cultural competencies can be added into the system. It is hoped a department would be identified as the stakeholder. Senator Berghoef suggested moving to a 90% confidence interval would change the credibility of the outcomes. Senator Zyla asked if rubric could be designed for outcomes. Franklund said the rubrics could be transcribed to aggregate data. The motion passed.

8. Announcements

President Eisler thanked Coordinator Franklund for their work on General Education. He also discussed his pride in the student initiative to clean up the alleys in Big Rapids. He also continues to have discussions about the financial situation, including the data from prior years, he has had a forum about enrollment and it will be a topic for the SPARC group. He also has set up a series of listening groups to gather input from faculty. (Senator Stone noted that another great action by a student group was the creation of the food pantry).

Provost Blake recognized a student who presented to the Board of Trustees and noted that each student matters. In recent weeks the Transfer Center has had sessions with 50 students about the closure of ITT. Twenty-four have already committed to attend Ferris State University. He has met with the Assessment Committee regarding their role in the Qualitative Initiative and plans a follow up meeting to draft a group with ownership and assessment. Senator Hanna asked it was yet available? Provost Blake said it was still in draft form

9. Open Forum.

Senator Lewis reminded the group of our slogan Imagine More. Senator Alspach noted that they have been hosting the Rwandan debate team.

10. The meeting was adjourned at 11:35 a.m.

Graduate Faculty Scholarship Policy

Context

Historically, Ferris State University has been viewed as an undergraduate university. In its current Carnegie Classification, its "basic" description is "Masters Colleges and Universities – Medium Programs." In recent years, an increasing number of graduate programs have been added, and the expectations for these programs have been inconsistently defined. Given its current structure, faculty load is determined at the level of Colleges. However, there are some common expectations for Ferris graduate faculty that transcend college boundaries. Greater clarity in the expectations of graduate faculty has been provided by the Higher Learning Commission (HLC), whose standards Ferris must meet. The purpose of this document is to reinforce the scholarship expectations of graduate faculty at Ferris, including those specified by HLC, and describe the Ferris approach to graduate faculty qualifications.

Policy

Graduate faculty should engage in scholarship appropriate to their disciplines and consistent with criteria established for graduate faculty by key entities, including the Higher Learning Commission, specialized accreditors, and/or professional societies.

Scholarship Defined at Ferris

At Ferris, scholarship may take many forms and will be that most relevant for the discipline or the individual faculty member's interests. In general, the University embraces the Boyer model of scholarship that incorporates Discovery, Integration, Application, and Teaching. With the university's career-oriented mission and focus on teaching and learning, scholarship may often incorporate analyses of practices in the professions, contributions to the field, and assessment of learning, as examples. Given the HLC's inclusion of "achievement," this scholarly engagement may include achievements appropriate to the field, such as holding a high-level position such as a presidency for leadership faculty or contributions to professional associations of other faculty. Ferris scholarship, however imagined or defined, will conform to graduate standards that provide for the sharing of these achievements or contributions (through presentations, original research, publications, inquiry projects, professional development sessions, etc.) and requires documentation in the University approved faculty activity reporting system, currently Digital Measures.

Academic Affairs Policy Letter Policy 17:5

Academic Affairs

ACADEMIC AFFAIRS TRANSFER POLICY FOR PASS/FAIL COURSES

This policy applies to a student who has taken a Pass/Fail course at another institution and wishes to have that course evaluated for transfer credit at Ferris State University. The following guidelines will apply in evaluation of the course for transfer credit.

- If a student receives a failing grade (grade of "Fail" or "F") for a Pass/Fail course, no credit will be awarded for that course at FSU.
- If a student receives a passing grade (grade of "Pass" or "P") for a Pass/Fail course that garners 0 credit, the course will be used exclusively for placement purposes.
- If a student receives a passing grade (grade of "Pass" or "P") for a Pass/Fail course that garners credit, one of the following conditions is to be applied:
 - 1. If the transfer course has a direct FSU equivalency, the student will receive credit for the FSU course.
 - 2. If the course does not have a direct FSU equivalency but aligns with a general education competency, the student will receive credit toward that competency equal to the number of credits for the course.
 - 3. If the course has neither a direct FSU equivalency nor alignment with a general education competency, the student will receive general credit equal to the number of credits for the course and at a level (100, 200, 300, 400) specified by the department that carries out the evaluation.

The faster industry standards change, the more important it is to have quality control programs and personnel that can meet the challenge. This area is so important to manufacturing that representatives from industry and the American Society for Quality Control assisted in developing this unique program.

This program is for individuals employed in quality or quality-related fields or who desire to become employed in a quality position within a manufacturing company. The program is designed for those who wish to expand and build upon the base of technical knowledge they have acquired through work experience and academic training. The program curriculum emphasizes a balance between applicable theory and practical hands-on learning. Typical students who enter this degree program are adults, working either full- or part-time, who often have direct experience in some aspect of manufacturing. All classes are offered at the Grand Rapids campus and are offered only at night. This program is designed for part time students; it will be difficult to attain a full-time schedule.

Graduates of the program are prepared to assume technical and leadership positions in all areas of quality within manufacturing companies. Position titles include Quality Manager, Quality Engineer, and Supplier Quality Engineer.

Admission Requirements:

- 1. 57 semester hours of college course work including technical courses, general courses, and technical-related courses.
- 2. A 2.50 GPA or department approval is required for admission.
- 3. All official college transcripts must be submitted at time of application.
- 4. To be considered for financial aid from Ferris, students must have earned an associate's degree or 56 semester hours. Students can be dually enrolled at Ferris State University and Grand Rapids Community College and be eligible to receive financial aid.
- 5. This program has a laptop computer requirement. See advisor for laptop specifications.
- "Successful Completion" of a course requires a grade of "C" or higher for any credits taken at an institution other then Ferris.
- 7. If re-admission is required, students are subject to the latest check sheet requirements

Graduation Requirements:

- To graduate, students must have a 2.0 CUMULATIVE GPA in all FSU courses and a minimum of 120 total semester hours.
- 2. At least 30 FSU semester hours must be completed to fulfill FSU residency requirements.
- 3. Students must meet the Departmental & University General Education Hours requirements listed above
- 4. Complete the Application for Graduation one term prior to expected graduation.

Admission requirements: First year student admission is open to high school graduates (or equivalent) who demonstrate appropriate academic preparedness, maturity and seriousness of purpose. High school courses and grade point average, ACT composite score, and ACT Mathematics and Reading sub scores will be considered in the admission and course placement process. Transfer students must have at least 12 credits at the time of application with a minimum 2.0 overall GPA including an English and mathematics course or they will be considered as first year students.

Students admitted to this program will be those indicating interest in the Psychology program but who have not met the minimum admission eligibility requirements. Faculty advisors will assist students with course work selection appropriate to establishing eligibility for the Psychology program which is: 2.0 college grade point average in a minimum of 12 college level credits. This course work should include a minimum grade of "C" in FSU's PSYC 150 or equivalent and successful completion of FSU's ENGL 150 and MATH 115 (or higher) or equivalent.

Appropriate course selection over two years could qualify the student for the Associate in Arts degree upon completion of a minimum 60 semester credits including the FSU general education requirements. For details, see the Liberal Arts program check sheet. This is not a Psychology associate degree.
