Ferris hosts concert by Something Corporate

BIG RAPIDS, Mich. – The Southern California rock band Something Corporate will be in concert on Thursday, Nov. 18, at Ferris State University, one of eight dates on a two-week tour to promote the quintet's first concert DVD.

The Autumn aLive concert, presented by students of the Ferris Music Industry Management Association, is scheduled for 8 p.m. in Wink Arena. Tickets are \$5 for FSU students (with Ferris identification card) and \$10 for the general public and are on sale at the Timme Center for Student Services, Ewigleben Ice Arena box office and online at starticketsplus.com.

Geffen Records will release "Something Corporate: Live At The Ventura Theater" on Nov. 9. The release corresponds with the arrival of the band's video performance of "Me & The Moon" at MTV2, Fuse and regional shows.

The new 90-minute video, shot last May during a national headlining tour, features live performances of "Hurricane," "21 & Invincible," "As You Sleep," "I Woke Up In A Car," "If I Die," "Me & The Moon," "I Kissed A Drunk Girl," "Only Ashes," "Ruthless," "Fall," "Down," "Wall," "Walking By," "Konstantine," "Space," "If U C Jordan" and "Punk Rock Princess." The DVD will be debuted with a special show at the Los Angeles House of Blues.

Something Corporate's latest CD, "North," debuted at No. 22 on Billboard's album chart and has sold more than 300,000 copies. The group isolated itself for two months in a Seattle studio to produce the more serious, moodier album. The Orange County-based band toured for two years straight in support of their debut album, "Leaving Through The Window," which sold more than 250,000 copies and cemented their status as a must-see band.

Something Corporate features Andrew McMahon on piano and vocals, Josh Partington and William Tell on guitar, Clutch on bass and Brian Ireland on drums. Their current tour also includes dates at colleges in New York, Pennsylvania and Ohio.
