- 2. Handbook of Services Paul Blake (And Summer Registration Changes)
 - Handouts: Handbook of Services Draft; Summer 2012 FFA Contract changes to summer course offerings.
 - Clarification document of routine vs. non-routine services provided by the Physical Plant.
 - Review and get back with any questions or clarifications.
 - Questions or feedback about summer registration?
 - On March 23, the 'B' courses (enrollment dependent) should be evaluated if not reached half cap to determine if it should or should not be cancelled.
 - ❖ Problem encountered: Holds for Fall snag up summer registration.
 - Problem encountered: Low enrollment because of summer's early registration dates and the separation of summer and fall registrations when in the past they occurred concurrently.
 - Should summer registration be extended? Think about it and let Paul Blake or Don Flickinger know.
- 3. Plans for a Student Assessment of On-Line Learning Deb Thalner
 - Handouts: Plans for Student Readiness for Online Learning, Blackboard Learn Screenshots, Life Factors
 - Need for pre-assessment of students before they take an online class to determine if online class is right for them.
 - Pilot consists of two parts: Assignments in Blackboard to test proficiency and taking a long survey called SmarterMeasure for self-assessment of life factors that could interfere with online learning.

- Pilot pre-assessment should take at least an hour for Blackboard and SmarterMeasure.
- ❖ Faculty are requested to encourage students to take the pilot assessment and give feedback.
- Concern: web-enhanced courses should also have competency requirements
- ❖ Concern: Might not be for graduate students, might be for more than fully online
- Challenge: What is the return of investment? Does it help students be successful? How are we going to measure? What about the costs? Benefits to instructors?
- Compliance is different than commitment. No tool can force a student to be committed.

- 4. CAS On-Line Course management Sandy Balkema & Andy Karafa
 - Having waitlists for all online courses controlled by CPTS made it difficult for Big Rapids campus students to register effectively.
 - ❖ A couple sections of online courses have been kept for Big Rapids campus students and will be controlled by the department, not CPTS.
 - ❖ Waitlists will be eliminated and students will be able to self-register in most cases if courses still have seats available.
 - Advisors (not students) should call department offices to get their advisees registered for reserved online courses.

5. Open Forum

- Culture change: collaboration is the important ingredient for culture change
- Are we going to try to serve students who need or want to complete a degree at night, not necessarily just online? How?
- Employers want to send their workers back to school, but we cannot serve them because we have limited nighttime classes and programs.
- ❖ Baker College is offering degrees that used to be only available at Ferris, with the added benefit of being at night or online. They are aggressively pursuing students' needs.
- 6. Updates from Colleges/Schools/Departments
 - As of the end of Summer, Recreation Management program is not accepting new students and will be closing. A Recreation Management minor will be offered.
 - Academic Advising Seminar this Thursday. Issues with emotional or difficult students.
 - ❖ International Festival moved to IRC on April 14, expanding to week-long festivities. April 11th, wine tasting around the continents, \$30. April 13th, quizbowl competition.
