  - How are measurements going to be acted upon?
  - Are student perceptions reliable as measurements?
  - A multi-faceted approach is necessary
  - How are general objectives such as good writing and critical thinking extended and reinforced across the board?

- Gen Ed should be revisited and a conversation held in regards to what program expectations are for Gen Ed to lay foundations for skills needed in later program courses
- Direct Measures 3 standardized tests (ACT, etc.)
- Indirect Measures are not popular
- IDEA comparisons of Ferris vs. other institutions is a good snapshot of Ferris trends
- Nationally, what is the correlation between student perception and overall value of program? In general, it is fairly accurate and reliable.
- Student perceptions should only be one method of measurement, perhaps 30%
- First step: start with direct measures and data we already have, set categories for measurement and use IDEA for one of those categories
- Student perceptions are important for retention
- IDEA is endorsed by faculty senate as an alternative to SAI
- Direct Measures to be discussed at a later date
- 4. Open Forum
  - Records Office is finding graduates of programs that never transferred into the program
  - (Financial Aid) State employment placements rates are now measured based upon everybody who enrolled in the program, not graduates of the program. As a result, Ferris now has a 30% placement rate
  - Requirements for student complaint policies are changing to include a link on the Ferris website allowing the student to complain directly to the state.
