Elizabeth R. Lorbeer is Western Michigan University School of Medicine New Library Director

In her role as library director, Lorbeer will oversee evaluation, assessment, and improvement of library services, systems, and procedures and strategic planning. She will work with WMed faculty to integrate informatics and library instruction into the curriculum and will respond to the research needs of the residency programs and other individuals connected with the medical school.



Lorbeer most recently served as the associate director for content management and as an associate professor at the University of Alabama at Birmingham, where she was responsible for overseeing the management of the biomedical collection at the Lister Hill Library of the Health Sciences. She is the past co-chair for the Publisher-Vendor-Librarian Interest Group for ALA-ALCTS and the principal investigator for three National Network of Libraries of Medicine Express Library Digitization Award grants. She consults regularly for publishers and vendors and is a distinguished member of The Academy of Health

Information Professionals. Lorbeer attained her undergraduate degree and earned a Master's in Library Sciences from State University of New York at Buffalo. She then completed a Master's of Education in Higher Education Administration from Boston University.

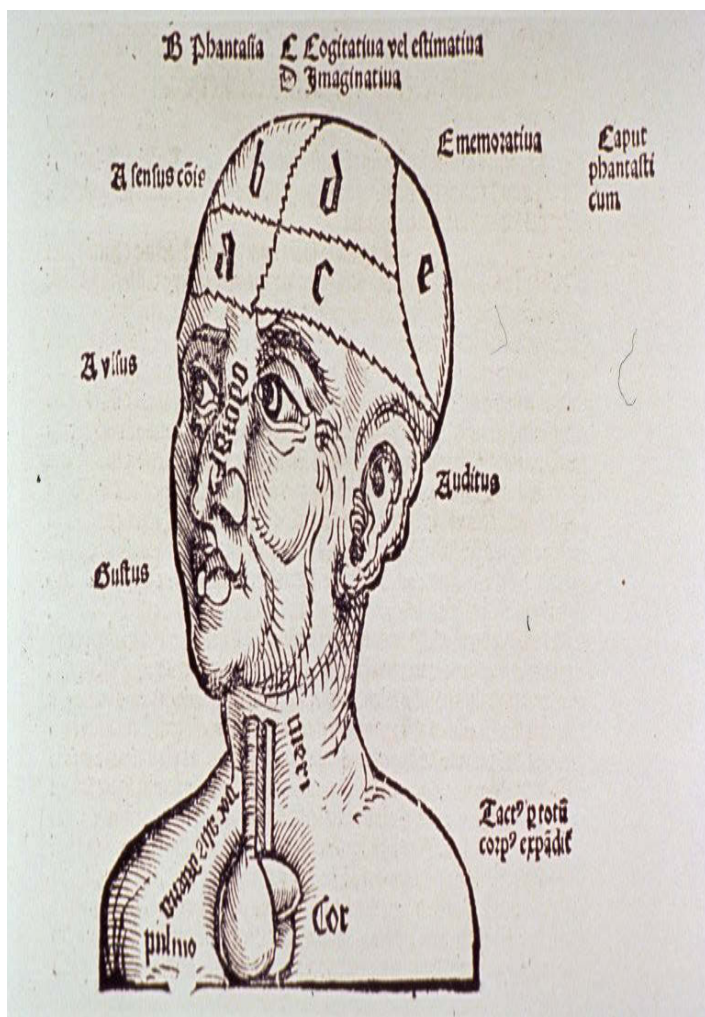
