Ferris 'Week of Action' promotes civic engagement

BIG RAPIDS – Faculty, staff and students at Ferris State University will have the opportunity to become civically engaged with the campus and local communities during the "Week of Action" programming scheduled for Feb. 21-25.

Sponsored by the Student Leadership and Activities Office, the events are aimed at promoting civic engagement through community service, political involvement and aroused discussion. The involvement will help participants learn the meaning and importance of civic engagement and how it can be accomplished.

During the initial event on Feb. 21, Bridget Clark, program coordinator of Kids' Food Basket, will speak in the Rankin Center Dome Room at 5 p.m. Clark started her organization when she attended Aquinas College. The group provides a bagged supper for 300 Grand Rapids elementary school children who would not otherwise receive an evening meal at home.

"Day at the State Capitol" on Feb. 22 provides students the opportunity to attend House and Senate sessions in Lansing where they can discuss higher education issues with legislators, learn the lobbying and legislative process, and participate in a House Civics Commission hearing. The event is sponsored by Michigan Campus Compact and requires a \$20 fee. The University is hosting "Get a Job. Get a Life. Or Both" on Feb. 23, a national teleconference sponsored by Michigan Campus Compact. The program's focus includes a discussion on the civic mission of higher education. The teleconference starts at 5 p.m. in Auditorium 004 of the Instructional Resource Center.
