Ferris hosts international authority on cloning

BIG RAPIDS – The controversial topic of cloning will be addressed by Nigel Cameron, founder of the journal *Ethics and Medicine*, during his March 22nd appearance at Ferris State University.

Dr. Cameron will speak at 7 p.m. in Williams Auditorium as part of the University's Arts and Lectures Series. The admission fee is \$5 per person.

Cameron is former Provost and Distinguished Professor of Theology and Culture at Trinity International University/Trinity Evangelical Divinity School in Deerfield, IL. He founded the Centre for Bioethics and Public Policy in London, chairs the Center for Bioethics in the Church and served as Dean of The Wilberforce Forum.

He has an international reputation as a spokesperson on bioethics and biotech issues, with appearances on ABC Nightline, PBS Frontline and other network television, in addition to testifying at congressional hearings. His Judeo-Christian perspectives on old and new issues in medicine and bioethics have led to the writing and editing of nine books.

Cameron lectures widely on college and medical school campuses, directs the Washington, DC-based Council for Biotechnology Policy and recently represented the United States at the United Nations meeting on human cloning.
