Local students participate in teambuilding competition

BIG RAPIDS – Several local high school students recently competed in the annual Spaghetti Bridge Competition at Ferris State University. The program spanned two days in the Rankin Student Center's Dome Room.

A total of 22 schools were entered in the competition, which featured a written report, oral presentation, authentic bridge design and load-bearing competition.

Members of each of the top three teams received partial scholarships to Ferris and the top five teams were awarded cash prizes. The actual bridge building occurred on the second day of competition when each team constructed the strongest structure possible using just two pounds of dry spaghetti and glue. The bridges were then tested for weight-bearing capacity.

Participating locally were two Kenowa Hills High School teams. The "Knight Stalkers," consisting of students **Brett Wainright**, **Ashley Brinkert**, **Dan Corner** and **Samantha Rettig**, and coaches **Mike Johnson** and **Christine Soderquist**, took first place in the authentic bridge competition and fourth in the oral competition. The second team, "Knight Slayers," included students **Jessica Everest**, **Luke Gauld**, **Katherine McCarthy** and **Carl Sobel**. The team took second in the written competition, and was also coached by Johnson and Soderquist.
