Ferris College of Technology seniors to display projects

BIG RAPIDS – An interesting range of senior projects by students in three College of Technology programs will be on display Friday, April 22, in Ferris State University's Rankin Center Dome Room.

Members of the campus and local communities are invited to view the ingenuity of students from the Computer Networks and Systems (CNS), Electrical/Electronics Engineering Technology (EET) and Mechanical Engineering Technology (MET) programs between 10 a.m. and 2 p.m.

As part of the CNS, EET and MET program requirements, seniors plan, design and build capstone projects and make a presentation for their faculty, peers and guests. More than two dozen projects will be displayed in a booth format from 10 a.m. to 2 p.m.

The projects include an Automated Basketball Shooting Practice Machine, Automated Drink Dispensing Machine, Automated Whiteboard Eraser System, Automated, Freeze-Proof Animal Watering System, Golf Putter Test Fixture, Heated Steering Wheel, Public Safety Controlled Entry System, Reciprocating Baby Stroller Rocker, Remote Start Grill and Wireless Wildlife Surveillance System.

In addition, the CNS and EET projects will be presented in a seminar format by the students involved with each project. These presentations in the adjacent Mecosta Room will start every half hour from 8:30 to 4 o'clock. There will be no seminars between noon and 1:30.
