Ferris student wins Volunteer Service Award

BIG RAPIDS – Crystal Flutur of Ludington, a printing management major enrolled in the College of Technology at Ferris State University, has received a Michigan Campus Compact Heart and Soul Award.

Michigan Campus Compact annually presents the awards to students from colleges and universities across the state. Three types of awards are given: the Outstanding Community Impact Award, the Commitment to Service Award and the Heart and Soul Award. The Heart and Soul award received by Flutur recognizes students for their time, effort and personal commitment through service to others.

Michigan Campus Compact is a state-level, non-profit organization that promotes the education and commitment of Michigan college students to be civically engaged citizens, through creating and expanding academic, co-curricular and campus-wide opportunities for community service, service-learning and civic engagement.

Flutur, a 2001 Mason County Central High School graduate, is actively involved in cross country and track, is a member of the National Residence Hall Honorary Honors Program and is also a Resident Advisor at Ferris. She is the daughter of Randy and Anne Flutur.
