Ferris student volunteers optometric services in West Indies

BIG RAPIDS – **Lindsey Wynkoop** of Elk Rapids, a Pre-optometry major enrolled in the College of Arts and Sciences at Ferris State University, recently participated in a Volunteer Optometric Services to Humanity mission to Dominica, West Indies.

During the eight-day mission, the 30-member team examined 1,100 patients, dispensed 1,800 pairs of eyeglasses and referred 131 patients for medical eye care.

Wynkoop, a 2002 Elk Rapids High School graduate, is the American Chemical Society student affiliate chapter president, is a local volunteer with the American Red Cross and is a member of the Pre-optometry Club, Student Alumni Gold Club and West Central Concert Band.
