CONSTRUCTION PROCRESS. Students, staff, and a stream of local visitors are beaming with satisfaction as they watch the new buildings take shape. Structural steel and steel for roof decks, scheduled for July 15-20 delivery, began to arrive last Thursday, the 12th. More is expected today. Men to erect it are expected today or tomorrow. Stone for window sills is expected this week.

Workmen will start today tearing out the first and second floor stairways at the west end of the Alumni Building corridor, and removing as much of the west wall as is necessary to join the Alumni Building to the West Building. This is being done at this time so that the new west exit from the Alumni Building will be ready for use by enrollment day, September 3.

SELECTIVE SERVICE. The Registrar's office last week began processing SSS109 forms which indicate to local Draft Boards the student's academic standing for the past college year.
