## THE STUDENTS OF FERRIS STATE UNIVERSITY RESOLVE:

Whereas, Visual Design and Web Media students use Macintosh computers daily for class projects; and

Whereas, there are only two Macintosh computer labs on the main campus of Ferris State University for students to use; and

Whereas, there are many PC labs on the main campus of Ferris State University for students to use; and

Whereas, PC labs are open 24-hours a day in FLITE and in residence halls; and

Whereas, because of budget decreases, hours of the two Macintosh computer labs in the College of Business have been drastically decreased over the past two years; and

Whereas, this creates frustration for Visual Design and Web Media students for their schedules are bound to the computer labs hours for working on their projects; and

Whereas, the cost of education is constantly increasing and it is an unfair requirement to have students purchase their own Macintosh computer for a class; and

Whereas, Visual Design and Web Media students should be given the same opportunity as students in other majors and should not be penalized because they cannot afford their own computer and therefore cannot use it for projects at any time during the day; and

Whereas, Visual Design and Web Media students have expressed their concerns to College of Business representatives on student government, be it

**Resolved**, that the College of Business work with FLITE in installing and maintaining at least two Macintosh computers in the 24-hour room for students to use for class purposes, putting an emphasis on software needed for the Visual Design and Web Media program.
