THE STUDENTS OF FERRIS STATE UNIVERSITY RESOLVE

WHEREAS, the Ferris State University Plan set forth by President David Eisler seeks to turn Ferris State University into an "engaged campus" focused on "civic learning"; and

WHERAS, part of being an engaged, civic learning campus is being aware of national and international events both politically and nonpolitically; and

WHERAS, Ferris State University currently provides no access to a national newspaper on campus; and

WHERAS, classroom curriculum could be strengthened with a readership program linking current events to lessons taught in class; and

WHERAS, Ferris State University is a college participant in the American Democracy Project partnered with the New York Times; and.

WHERAS, students have expressed an interest in gaining access to a nationally read newspaper; therefore, be it

RESOLVED, That the Student Government of Ferris State University will send a delegation of members before the Division of Finance to apply for funding; and therefore, be it further

RESOLVED, That the Student Government of Ferris State University will support the implementation of this program both peripherally and directly.
