- A. - B. Election of At Large Senate Executive Board Member President Papo opened floor for nominations. Senator Ryan nominated Senator Griffin, with support from Senator Parry. Senator Konrad moves by acclimation to place Senator Griffin on the Senator Executive Board, with support from Senator Conati. Motion carries.

A. College of Business MBA – Organizational Systems and Performance Metrics – Motion by Senator Konrad, with support from Senator Ferdowsi, to approve the new MBA. Following a lengthy discussion, Senator Nagel moves to table the approval of the MBA, with support from Senator Aiken. President Papo asked for clarification on dates of President's Council from Vice President Chapman. Senator Nagel raises a point of order, states Robert's Rules are not being followed. There should be no debate or discussion following motion and second to table item. Motion fails.
