AIMS

Over the past few years MHSLA has shown signs of increasing maturity as a library organization. These signs include the continued sponsorship of an annual educational conference, the MHSLA News, a working committee structure within the organization and especially, the development of effective local organizations. While the local groups of MHSLA have grown into effective organizations and since the local groups now have the experience in forming strong, working organizations capable of promoting health science libraries, these talents should be utilized again in making MHSLA an equally effective regional library organization. Becoming an effective organization is in my view the most important goal for MHSLA in the next few years. The reason why I offer this as my goal is due to the demands placed on MHSLA, demands made by other local and regional organizations who see MHSLA as the representative of the Michigan health science library community, and demands made by our own local groups. The leadership of MHSLA must assume a state-wide perspective in order to encompass all kinds of libraries and library personnel within Michigan in the hope of pulling resources together to better solve the problems of Michigan's health science libraries. Because of my unique experience as a hospital and academic librarian, I am able to see the issues facing MHSLA from more than one perspective. I think the shaping and changing of MHSLA into a responsive regional organization can occur so that sponsorship of co-operative library projects will become a regular activity of MHSLA. Two such co-operative projects include: whether MHSLA should seek chapter status within the new group structure of the Medical Library Association and the possibility of creating a state-wide union list of health science serials. As president-elect I would try to bring to the association a sense of perspective that will encourage the association to achieve its goal as an effective regional organization.
