Wyoming native helps Ferris take home math prize

BIG RAPIDS – On April 1, a team of three students from Ferris State University including graduate student Ngoc-Anh La of Wyoming, and seniors Jeremy Houser of Cadillac and Nathan Butler of Traverse City, won the 30th Annual Lower Michigan Mathematics Competition held at Hope College in Holland.

The team from Ferris took first place in the field of 35 teams from 11 different colleges and universities. Butler, Houser and La scored 57 points out a possible 100.

In the competition, teams of two or three students work together on 10 challenging mathematical problems over three hours, without any external aids or technology.

"This is a big accomplishment, defeating the historical heavy-hitters of Calvin, Hope and Albion colleges, among the rest of the teams," said Michael Dekker, assistant professor of mathematics at Ferris.

Each year the winner of the LMMC gets to display the traveling Klein Bottle Trophy. A Klein bottle is "a non-orientable topological manifold, which technically only exists in four dimensions," according to Dekker. A three-dimensional glass version adorns the LMMC trophy, which the Ferris team will keep for a year and defend at the 2007 competition slated to be held at Calvin College.
