Jim Crow Museum Opening

On Thursday, April 26, we will officially open the new Jim Crow Museum. The JCM has for several years been a powerful teaching and learning resource at Ferris, but we believe experiencing these artifacts in the museum's new home in the FLITE library even more of a truly emotional experience.

Opening day events include a 10 a.m. reception in the G. Mennon Williams Auditorium lobby, followed by an 11 a.m. ceremony in the auditorium. At 1 p.m. there will be a conversation with Dr. David Pilgrim in the Rankin Art Gallery, and at 2 p.m. conversation with artist Jon McDonald who painted the "Cloud of Witnesses" mural in the new JCM. At 4 p.m. there will be a performance by the Grand Valley State University Act on Racism performance group. All afternoon there will be tours of the new museum.

If you are unable to make it to any of the dedication activities, I hope that you will make it a point to visit the museum soon. I can think of no other exhibition that so clearly and directly confronts the reality of this African-American experience. It is very exciting to open this resource to the public.

Events Throughout The Week

This is a time of year when there are many cultural, educational and celebratory events taking place at our University. I want to briefly highlight a few of these. More events and further detail about those mentioned here are available on the Campus Calendar accessible on the Ferris home page.

Shakespeare Festival - On Tuesday, April 17, from 11 a.m. to noon on the campus Quad, the Department of Languages and Literature will host the annual Shakespeare Festival. There will be scenes from the Bard's plays, period costumes and more. This event is free and open to the Ferris and Big Rapids communities.

Annual Spring Band and Orchestra Concert - On Wednesday, April 18, from 8-9 p.m. in Williams Auditorium, the 2011-12 concert season will come to a close with the Annual Spring Band and Orchestra Concert, featuring the FSU Symphony Band, the FSU West Central Concert Band and the FSU West Central Chamber Orchestra. This event is free and open to the public.

Take Back the Night - This event to raise awareness of violence against women will take place on Thursday, April 19. The march will start in the IRC Connector at 6:30 p.m. and will continue along State Street to Williams Auditorium. Steve Thompson's keynote presentation, "No Zebras: No Excuses," which addresses the impact of intervention on situations of sexual aggression, will be at 7 p.m. in Williams Auditorium.

ALSAME Conference - On Friday, April 20, Ferris will host the 12th annual Advocates for Latino Student Advancement in Michigan Education youth conference. ALSAME is a non-profit educational group that provides services to Latino students and the Hispanic community. About 650 students from 16 different west Michigan high schools are scheduled to attend this year's conference. Roy Juarez will give the opening address at 9 a.m. and Michael Reyes will give the

keynote address at 2 p.m. in Williams Auditorium. More information about ALSAME and the 2012 conference is available at www.alsame.org.

Dawg Days - This coming Saturday, Enrollment Services will host the final Dawg Day of the semester. These Dawg Day events are a very important part of our enrollment efforts to reach out to prospective students and their parents.
