Hockey

This past weekend was a truly amazing time for our men's hockey team. Even before they reached the ice, the team had the opportunity to experience being in the national spotlight, which included a red carpet reception at the Tampa airport and the Tampa Bay Times Forum, and many, many interviews with national media. Coverage of the championship appeared on ESPN, in the *New York Times*, *Wall Street Journal*, USA *Today*, *Washington Post* and many others. If you saw the broadcast of the championship games, you saw several of our players featured in short interviews.

There was a large contingent of Ferris fans in Tampa, with three busloads travelling twentysix hours to the game and nearly 500 tickets sold in Big Rapids. The Ferris Pep Band, directed by Dale Skornia, was in evidence throughout the Frozen Four, supporting our team and encouraging our fans. Ferris alumni from across the nation gathered to cheer for their alma mater.

Our team reached the NCAA Division-I National Championship game by defeating Union College 3-1 in the tournament's semi-final game Thursday afternoon. In the finals on Saturday they faced number one ranked Boston College. The final 4-1 score does not reflect what a close and hard-fought game it was. The score was 2-1 until late in the third period. Our team showed that they very much deserved to play for the national title, and came very close to bringing home the championship.

Everyone I have talked with has expressed the great pride they have in our team's accomplishments this season and how well they reflect our university's mission. There were many honors for our team in Tampa. For the second year in a row we have two All-Americans, goalie Taylor Nelson and defenseman Chad Billins. Coach Bob Daniels was chosen as the national coach of the year. Bob also earned this honor in 2003.

In Tampa we learned that a Bulldog had been named the 89 winner of the Frozen Four. "89" represents the 89 championships the NCAA sponsors. At each one they recognize the player with the highest grade point average. For this championship that scholar-athlete was Ferris' Tommy Hill. Tommy is representative of the entire team. In his press conference on campus before the championship, Coach Daniels noted that the team's cumulative grade point average last semester was over 3.4.

This has been amazing experience and one which makes us immensely proud. Ferris has made an impression on the hockey world and attracted attention from across the country. There is great pride in the accomplishments of these young men, in their coaches, in our university, and in our community.

Please join in me in congratulating the team and Coach Daniels on a truly memorable and historic season.

Honorary Degrees

At our Spring Commencement ceremonies this year we will confer honorary degrees upon three eminent recipients. The Ferris Board of Trustees has voted to grant honorary doctorates to Dr. JoLaine Draugalis, Rick DeVos and Dr. Brent Knight.

A Ferris alumna, Dr. Draugalis has served as Dean of the College of Pharmacy, The University of Oklahoma Health Sciences Center, since 2007 and also holds the David Ross Boyd Professorship. Her research focuses on pharmaceutical education program design, administration and evaluation. Her many honors include the American Pharmaceutical Association's Gloria Niemeyer Francke Leadership Mentor Award; the American Association of Colleges of Pharmacy's Distinguished Pharmacy Educator Award; the University of Arizona's Henry and Phyllis Koffler Prize for Teaching; and the American Pharmacists Association's Research Achievement Award in the Pharmaceutical Sciences.

Rick DeVos is best known for launching ArtPrize, the innovative art competition in Grand Rapids. Last year the city-wide event attracted 1582 entries, drew more than 200,000 visitors, generated over \$10.3 million in revenue for the Grand Rapids area, and attracted global interest in West Michigan, while awarding more than \$470,000 in prize money to artists. 2012 will see the fourth annual run of this hugely popular competition. Rick's work nurturing entrepreneurship includes his establishment of Momentum, a business accelerator for companies focused on webbased technologies. DeVos is a native of the Grand Rapids area and is one of West Michigan's most indefatigable promoters. In addition to his many ventures, he is also a board member of the Urban Institute for Contemporary Arts in Grand Rapids.

Dr. Brent Knight, a Ferris alumnus, has been president of Lansing Community College since July 1, 2008. President Knight has brought a unique blend of expertise to LCC. He previously served as president of Morton College in Cicero, Illinois; Pierce College in Tacoma, Washington; and Triton College in River Grove, Illinois. Since joining Lansing Community College, President Knight has focused his efforts on student success, offering programs relevant to the 21st century workforce, ensuring access to education and being a good steward of public resources. Among his many public service efforts, Dr. Knight has served the community as Chairman of the Fredrick Meijer Gardens and Sculpture Park in Grand Rapids.

I look forward to honoring these outstanding individuals and hearing their remarks for our students during Spring Commencement May 4^{th} and 5^{th} .
