Testimony to Senate Education Committee

Last Wednesday I testified to the Michigan Senate Education Committee regarding proposed legislation that would allow community colleges to offer bachelor's degrees. In my testimony I raised a number of issues that argue against expanding the number of institutions in the state that grant four-year degrees. These include a decline in public school enrollment in the state since 2002, the cost to taxpayers for the faculty and equipment to start new programs, and the very great likelihood that funding for an expansion of four-year degrees will require the state to divert resources from existing universities and/or necessitate community colleges to increase tuition.

In my remarks I also took the opportunity to tell the committee members about the vital partnerships Ferris has with community colleges across the state to increase access to four-year programs through site-based programs. I reiterated our desire to meet community college needs for bachelor degrees through additional partnerships.

This is an important issue for the state and for our students. You are well aware of the decline in state funding for higher education over the past several decades. Should this legislation pass, I believe that programs in more areas will be added. Imaging the state's already thinly spread resources having to cover even more four-year programs is not a pleasant prospect.
