## Budget Forums

Thank you to everyone who attended the two budget forums last week. I appreciate the excellent attendance at both meetings. Clearly, the University community is aware of the troubled condition of the Michigan economy and the implications the state's difficulties present for Ferris.

As mentioned during my presentations, one of the goals for these forums is to continue to make the budget process at the University open and transparent. During the remainder of this semester I will keep you updated as developments regarding the state's economy and subsequent budgetary actions unfold. The coordinated efforts on the part of the Ferris community, which have been facilitated by your awareness of the challenges facing us, have helped immensely in minimizing to this point the negative impact of reductions in state support. Thank you again for taking the time to be engaged in these developments which have a direct impact on our students, our people, and our University.

## Festival for the Arts

This week begins the third year of the revitalized Festival of the Arts. The Festival officially begins this Thursday, January 28, with an opening ceremony and reception at the Big Rapids City Commission Chambers. Kendall College of Art and Design President Oliver Evans will give this year's keynote address.

The Festival has an extraordinary line up of presentations ranging from the visual arts to literature, architecture to music, and some events that blur the lines between different artistic impulses. The majority of events are free, while others have very modest ticket prices. Additionally, there are various workshops and presentations that allow participants to get actively involved in the creative process.

Bruce Dilg has been a driving force in the resurgence of this tradition that draws upon the resources of both Ferris State University and the City of Big Rapids. Professor Scott Cohen, former Ferris Director of Music Bill Donahue, Big Rapids Director of Neighborhood Services Mark Gifford, and Tuba Bach founder Edward Mallett also serve with Bruce on the Festival Executive Board.
