- 11 a.m. - 5 p.m., a special post office cancellation event in the Quad
- 11:30 a.m., annual Faculty and Staff Welcome Back Picnic in the Quad
- 1:30 p.m., panel discussion on Ferris History with Ray Dickinson, Melinda Isler, Bob Leach, Larry Martin and Richard Santer in the Dome Room
- 3 p.m. - 7 p.m., Ice Cream Social and family Founders' Days events in the Quad
- 6 p.m., "Unsolved History: The Burning of Old Main," including firsthand account by Robert Andrews, a student at that time who was injured in the fire, and others present at the fire, in Williams Auditorium

Before assuming the FLITE dean's position, Leah Monger served as department head for library systems and operations. Additionally, Leah has served on various library and University committees. She also is working with a team to formulate emergency response procedures and a disaster recovery plan for the library. With more than 10 years experience at Ferris, Leah brings important continuity to this position.
