Strategic Planning

In March David McFarland visited Big Rapids to begin an environmental scan for a strategic planning effort. This strategic plan development will continue through much of the next school year. Dr. McFarland will return to campus next Monday and Tuesday to report on his findings, solicit input from faculty and staff, and recommend next steps. Two forums are scheduled that are open to all faculty and staff. The first is on Monday, April 16th, from 2-4 pm in the Rankin Center Founders Room and the second on Tuesday, April 17th, from 9-10:30 am also in the Founders Room.

It is important this strategic planning effort be lead by a faculty member, someone with a record of significant achievements and whose involvement spans across colleges and divisions. In inquiring about possible choices for this leadership, there was one name that was mentioned frequently, Dr. Robert von der Osten. Michael Ryan, President of the FFA, also suggested Dr. von der Osten. After visiting with Robert, I too, am convinced that he is the right person for this responsibility and am delighted to announce he has accepted this invitation. As a part of these responsibilities, Dr. von der Osten will join Dr. McFarland in a meeting of nearly 40 faculty and staff, and a meeting of the combined deans and presidents council as part of the next steps in this process.

Wellness

There is a phenomenon happening on our campus. Perhaps you remember last year's hit television show, The Biggest Loser. Through the efforts of the Ferris Wellness Team, a Biggest Loser effort has been organized on campus and the response has been overwhelming. There are 29 teams of 4-6 people from the campus and community involved with this very popular activity to feel better and live longer through a combination of healthy diet and exercise. On Saturday YBBW will sponsor their 14th Annual Conference, "The Many Faces of a Woman," at the Holiday Inn. Also on Saturday is the 5K Run/Walk for Kids to benefit the Children's Miracle network. At 1 pm our ladies softball team will host Ashland University in a double header.

Saturday evening the Williams Live! Series welcomes the Chicago Brass Quintet to campus at 8 pm. On Sunday is one of the most popular events of the year, the International Festival of Cultures, which begins in the Rankin Center at 1 pm. Please come out, support our international students, and celebrate cultures from around the world.

At the end of each year many usable items are wasted as students clean out of residence halls and apartments across the community. This project collects these usable items and distributes them to charities for people throughout our community who are in need. Saturday April 20th is our first Dump and Run where students are encouraged drop off materials they would otherwise discard at the old Ford Garage, now used as the bus garage, on State Street between noon and 6:00 pm.
