# President's Memorandum to Faculty and Staff

Office of the President April 28, 2006

This final week of the semester has included a steady stream of award banquets, student recognition ceremonies, and retirement celebrations. In attending these events I am continually reminded of your dedication to the University and your students. And the results are obvious in the extraordinary achievements of our students and their comments on how much they appreciate your efforts for them. I want to take this opportunity to share with you updates on continuing efforts, special recognitions, and some of the incredible accomplishments of our students.

## Legislative Update

The House Appropriations Subcommittee on Higher Education released its preliminary budget on Wednesday. I am very pleased the House chose to follow the formula it developed last year. This approach rewards universities for growth and for educating students in high-cost and high-need professions. The House recommendation for Ferris State University is a 4% increase, \$1,945,400. This is significantly more than the Executive budget and Senate budget, which had recommended 1.7% or 1.8%, about \$850,000.

The Subcommittee took an important first step toward addressing our increased retirement costs from MPSERS. In their budget they recommended an allocation of \$1,683,400 for increased costs at the seven MPSERS universities. Our share of this would be \$235,000. It is significant that in doing so the committee adopted the approach we proposed, and used the data collected by Sally DePew in our budget office. In addition the Subcommittee recommended increased funding to help cover institutional costs for the Native American tuition waiver. Figured at \$3,000 per waiver, our share from this would be \$135,000.

While all of this is very good news, there is still a long way to go. There are possible changes to this budget at the Subcommittee, at the Committee, and then by the full House. This is before the higher education budget goes to committee discussions with the Senate and resolution with the Governor. The proposal as it stands now will be controversial, as it recommends 2% cuts to Wayne, Northern, and Lake Superior. Besides Ferris, other universities recommended for the maximum 4% increase are Central, Grand Valley, Oakland, Saginaw, U-M Dearborn, U-M Flint, and Western. Michigan and Michigan State would receive an increase of 3.5%, Eastern 2.7%, and Michigan Tech 1.9%. We are very pleased the House has responded so positively to our message for support and will work with them to promote this budget.

### **Faculty Recognition**

- Our women's golf team captured the GLIAC conference championship by three strokes. They are coached by Brad Bedortha.
- Advertising students competed in the National Student Advertising Competition, placing second. In doing so they earned praise from judges and the competition director for their excellent preparation and good sportsmanship. Their advisor is Tom Mehl.
- Digital animation students at FSU-GR recently completed a game project to help teach school students about the Michigan Supreme Court. They have also placed their first international intern in digital animation ~ in Singapore. This group was advised by Marty Lier.
- Students from the HVACR program received the Jeff Forker for Training Excellence at the convention of the Air Conditioning Contractors of America. Their advisor is Joe Compton.

If you are aware of other examples of student achievement I would enjoy hearing of them so that I can share these stories of success.
