New Responsibilities

The beginning of a new year brings changes and new opportunities for our people. I am delighted to welcome Miles Postema as the General Counsel for the University. With his experience and knowledge of our University he is a strong addition to our leadership team. In the College of Technology, Tom Oldfield has accepted our invitation to serve as Dean while a search is conducted to fill this position. Tom's understanding of academics at Ferris State University makes him a wonderful choice for this position. In the College of Technology he is joined by Ron McKean, who has accepted the college's Assistant Dean position. In Academic Affairs, Roxanne Cullen has become Associate Vice President for Academic Affairs. She and Vice President Michael Harris are joined by Pat Klarecki, who has accepted a position as Assistant Vice President for Academic Affairs. In Student Affairs Associate Vice President Mike Cairns also now serves as Dean of Students. In University Advancement and Marketing we are pleased to welcome Amber MacKenzie, who joins us as Assistant Vice President for Development. Amber is a native of Big Rapids and most recently worked in fund raising efforts at Western Michigan University.

There are a number of new leaders in academic affairs, assistant and associate deans, department chairs and heads. In the College of Allied Health we welcome to campus Theresa Raglin who is the department head for Dental Hygiene and Medical Imaging. In the College of Arts and Sciences Kevin Miller serves as Assistant Dean and Reinhold Hill as Department Head for Languages and Literature. On September 1st, 1884 Woodbridge Ferris opened the doors of the Big Rapids Industrial School for its first day of classes. To celebrate this heritage and to provide an opportunity for the University community to come together, we have created Founders' Day. As a part of these ceremonies we will set the large tent up on the University Quadrangle and invite all members of the University Community to join us for lunch.

The day's celebrations begin with a Founders' Room Open House in the Rankin Center at 10:00 am hosted by the History Commemoration Task Force. At 11:00 I'll be presenting some thoughts on our founders, our heritage, and our future in the Rankin Center Dome Room. This will be followed by lunch on the Quad. At 2:00 pm I'll continue my session from the morning with a question and answer session in the Founders' Room. As part of the celebration, Student Activities has planned an entire evening of activities for our students later that day.

My hope is that Founders' Day will become a meaningful occasion where we can gather as a University community to celebrate our past and consider our future. I encourage you can to join us on Thursday and look forward to visiting with you.
