## President's Memorandum to Faculty and Staff

Office of the President February 1, 2005

It seems difficult to believe that February has already arrived. There is much good news regarding Ferris State University that I want to share with you. These are but a few of the many, many examples of good work and hard effort that demonstrate the extra effort you make to help our University be a special place.

## Good News and Good Efforts

Last week members of our Optometry faculty and staff spent three evenings calling their alumni. These efforts netted over \$170,000 in pledges, a truly remarkable achievement. Special thanks go to Jamie Brady, Christine Kamen, Carla Miller, Kaci Baars, Dr. Robert Buckingham, Dr. Philip Walling, Dr. Nancy Peterson-Klein, Dr. Michael Keating, Dr. Bruce Morgan, Dr. James Saladin, Dr. Randy Vance, Maureen Watson, Dr. Michael Cron, Dr. Walter Betts, Dr. Robert Carter, Dr. Renee Mika and Dean Kevin Alexander for helping to develop this support for our new facility. As a part of our fundraising efforts new visuals of this building project have been created. We are very hopeful that our efforts for this much needed facility will be accompanied by support from the legislature during this session.

Ferris State University is included in an article in the February issue of the *Business Officer* magazine, published by NACUBO (National Association of College and University Business Officers). Last year the Ferris Foundation earned a remarkable 23.7% on its endowment investments. This was the eighth best performance by any foundation in the country and increased the value of our endowment to \$23 million. Our appreciation goes to the investment committee of the Ferris Foundation and the Fund Evaluation Group, LLC, which manage these funds. This is a remarkable achievement and will provide additional support for faculty and staff grants and scholarships for students. The opportunity has developed to purchase the Forest Hills Trailer Park, which is south of our campus and contiguous to the Racquet Facility. This is a property of approximately 30 acres that also adjoins a portion of our campus southern boundary and the Muskegon River. While there are not immediate campus plans for this area, I believe this is in the best long-term interests of our University. Hopefully we will be able to complete this purchase before the end of February. On Friday Governor Granholm appointed two new members to our Board of Trustees. Both are graduates and distinguished alumni of Ferris State University. George Menoutes, a graduate of the College of Pharmacy, has 45 years experience in the pharmacy profession and a history of civic and state involvement. As a student at Ferris he served as class president and captain of the football team. Ron Snead is a biology graduate and currently serves as Vice President of Corporate Relations for Dixien, a supplier of metal stampings and plastic molded parts to the automotive industry. As a student at Ferris he served as president of the NAACP chapter and vice president of the All-College Student Government. Enrollment is up for winter semester 2005 at Ferris. This is the first winter semester when we have enrolled more than 11,000 students.
