## **President's Memorandum to Faculty and Staff**

Over the past two weeks five finalists for the Vice President of Academic Affairs (VPAA) position have interviewed on campus. This was an outstanding group of candidates, each qualified to be a VPAA in their own way. I want to extend my thanks to the search committee and their chair, Nancy Peterson-Klein, for a truly outstanding job in screening candidates, selecting finalists, and coordinating the interview process both in Big Rapids and Grand Rapids.

During the next few days I have scheduled thirty-three meetings with individuals involved in this search. This information will be combined with the surveys completed at each interview, reference checks, conference calls, the application letter, resume, and other supporting materials. However beyond this I need your help in making the final decision for this position. If you visited with the candidates while they were on campus I would very much appreciate it if you would share your thoughts and observations with me via email. It is not necessary for you to have seen each candidate. The following information would be helpful -

- Which candidates did you see?
- What were their strengths, weaknesses?
- In your interactions and observations with the candidates were there things that impressed or concerned you?
- What do you think is the growth potential of the candidates over the next five years?
- Are there other observations, opinions, or information you would like to share?

I would appreciate receiving this by Thursday, January 29, so I may consider it in my deliberations. Thank you for participating in this important search and for taking time to share your thoughts with me. I am hopeful we can introduce our new vice president to the campus by the middle of February.

## 2004-2005 Planning Discussions

Next Tuesday, Wednesday and Thursday we will be conducting planning meetings for the 2004-2005 academic year. The format for this year's meetings has changed with more of an emphasis upon assessment and discussion.
