The candidate interview schedule includes two opportunities for faculty to visit with each candidate, an open forum for staff and other members of the university community, and a time for students to meet the candidate. Each candidate's schedule is available at

As you see members of the committee on our campus I am hopeful you will thank them for the time and effort they invested in this process. They are truly an extraordinary search committee. I am especially appreciative of Nancy Peterson-Klein for the strong, thoughtful leadership she has provided to this group. It is my expectation that we will select and be able to announce our next Vice President for Academic Affairs by mid-February.

You may recall that I have visited with you about my intentions to use each administrative leadership vacancy at Ferris as an opportunity to have an external review of the division or college. On December 8 - 10, Dr. George Mehaffy, Vice President for Academic Leadership and Change at the American Association of State Colleges and Universities, and Dr. Marlene Strathe, Provost and Senior Vice President for Academic Affairs at Oklahoma State University, visited our campus to review academic affairs as a division. Both George and Marlene have many years of successful service as chief academic officers and during their time on campus had the opportunity to meet with many members of the academic and university community.

As consultants Drs. Mehaffy and Strathe have done their job in precisely the manner that I had hoped they would, stating their findings in a clear and straight-forward style. In reading this, I believe it is helpful to remember that the report states opinions, not facts, and that these opinions were formed over a short period of time. There very well may be sections or statements of this report with which you disagree and perhaps strongly so. While it is an input to possible future directions in academic affairs, it is not a road map for what we should or will do. Most certainly it does not prescribe what the agenda for the next Vice President for Academic Affairs should be. However I believe it will be helpful to both our next vice president and our academic community as we seek to move forward in the future. Planning Discussions

I thought it was very important to schedule the Vice President of Academic Affairs interviews in January and as close together as possible. Undoubtedly some of the people identified as finalists by our search committee will be favored in other searches and if they should be our choice, I don't want to lose them because of the schedule. Additionally I believe it is easier to compare and contrast candidates when the process does not drag on for a significant period of time. To accommodate the interview schedule it has been necessary to rearrange the original schedule for planning discussions. These are now scheduled as follows -
