

1. The Librarian's Role in Information Mastery: Assessing the Usefulness of Clinical Information Sources.

David Slawson, M.D. B. Lewis Barnet Jr. Professor of Family Medicine University of Virginia, Charlottesville

Come together under the umbrella of information mastery to find and incorporate the best information based on the "Usefulness of Medical Information" equation. To avoid being swept away by the torrent of medical information, librarians and clinicians must develop effective and efficient ways to identify and evaluate useful information. The "Usefulness of Medical Information" equation stresses the need to evaluate information for a balance among three concepts: validity, relevance, and the time it takes to find it.

This course presents practical and easy to use methods for gaining control of medical information by focusing on ways to get the best information at the right time and for the right situation. Participants in this one day course will learn to analyze clinical information needs and learn new skills to investigate tools and resources to increase their confidence and efficiency in obtaining information.

2. Conflict Management

Debra Nelson Dunbar, M.S. University Employee and Organizational Development Services Indiana University, Bloomington, IA Failure to manage workplace conflict effectively drains the energy and morale of employees and ultimately impacts performance and productivity. The purpose of this session is to increase the participants' understanding of the sources of conflict and their personal conflict management style. Participants will learn and apply a model for managing conflict that uses fundamental communication tools, focuses on identifying the interests underlying the conflict, promotes mutual understanding and ultimately causes those in conflict to identify the conditions necessary to manage their differences and plan to create those conditions.

Designed for supervisors, or those who want to be supervisors, this class provides real-life examples of workplace conflicts and offers practical tips on how to address these sticky situations. She will address your real-life situations as well. Debra Nelson Dunbar has been working with universities, companies, health care institutions and financial institutions for the last 14 years. She conducts approximately 300 dynamic and interactive training programs on an annual basis.



Evaluating Research Articles in Academic Journals
