

#### CONFERENCE NOTES

THE KEYNOTE SPEAKER, Margaret E. Auer, is Director of Libraries at the University of Detroit. She was named Librarian of the Year in 1988 by the Michigan Library Association. She is very active in Library Associations, and has presented a number of library-focused programs. Her Keynote address will present proven methods, from the job posting to the daily coaching for fostering a positive library image through a public service-oriented staff. Focus will be on techniques to use when meeting your public, ncluding verbal and non-verbal communication.
