Kelly Cothery places third in Ferris State University speech contest

BIG RAPIDS – Kelly Cothery of Spring Lake took third place in an all-campus public speaking contest at Ferris State University last fall. The contest was hosted by the Ferris communication honor society Lambda Pi Eta and forensics honor society Pi Kappa Delta.

In light of the fall elections, contestants were invited to present a five-to eight-minute speech related to the theme "Political Engagement."
