## First Doctorate of Community College Leadership Students to Graduate from Ferris

BIG RAPIDS – The inaugural class of students empowered to lead community colleges into the future will graduate Friday, May 10 with a Doctorate in Community College Leadership from Ferris State University.

Cohort One's 23 graduates, who began their studies in the summer of 2010, will participate in commencement ceremonies at 7 p.m. in the Convocation Center (Wink Arena) in the Ewigleben Sports Complex on Big Rapids campus.

"Members of this leadership group expressed their trust in Ferris State University when they enrolled in a brand new doctoral program. The university earned that trust by delivering a high-quality, responsive and relevant program that prepares the group for future leadership opportunities in a variety of contexts," said associate provost and program director Roberta Teahen.

"Many of the Cohort One graduates report that they have not only taken on broader responsibilities and leadership roles within their colleges, but they also find themselves interpreting situations in their colleges from a more global view and informed perspective."

Ferris created the three-year doctoral program for students seeking key leadership roles at mission-driven, 21st century community colleges nationwide. The practice-informed-by-theory program addresses issues leaders will face in an evolving education environment.

"The curriculum is designed to provoke inquiry, increase the ability to problem-solve and to encourage action," said student Kathryn Mullins. "The DCCL program prepared me to effectively advance the community college mission, and I am excited to transfer this passion and knowledge into my current – and future – leadership roles."

Mullins, who earned bachelor's and master's degrees in Business Administration from Baker College, is executive deputy to the president and board liaison at Grand Rapids Community College. Her "ultimate" goal is to serve as a community college president, she said.

"The decision to enroll in the DCCL program was simple," she said. "I wanted an application-based program that included extensive exposure to experienced community college leaders, including presidents, and I also needed a program that could be completed in three years and allowed for

immediate application of the concepts and skills learned."

Many DCCL students have transitioned into new roles while completing the program due to their growth and professional development, said assistant director Andrea Wirgau.

"One student got a new job that was a step up the administrative ladder specifically because one of our classes, the Practica, provided experience and exposure to those leaders who noticed her abilities and talents," Wirgau said. "Ferris has many reasons to be extremely proud of this first graduating class."
