Changes to Michigan Public School Employees Retirement System (MPSERS)

Earlier this month the legislature and governor passed and signed SB 1040, which makes major changes in MPSERS, the retirement plan for a little over 200 employees at Ferris. MPSERS employees should have received both electronic and written correspondence regarding these changes.

If you have followed the news regarding these MPSERS changes you know that an injunction was granted to stop the implementation of this bill. A hearing on this is scheduled for November. However, the state is moving forward with the administrative steps needed for implementation of the changes. All MPSERS employees should have received communication from the State Office of Retirement Services (ORS) informing them of the retirement decisions they need to make by Oct. 26.

To help our MPSERS employees we have scheduled an information session for Oct. 11 from 4:30-6 p.m. in the Rankin Center Dome Room. In addition, our Human Resource Office will respond to questions and ORS/MPSERS may be contacted directly at 800-381-5111.
