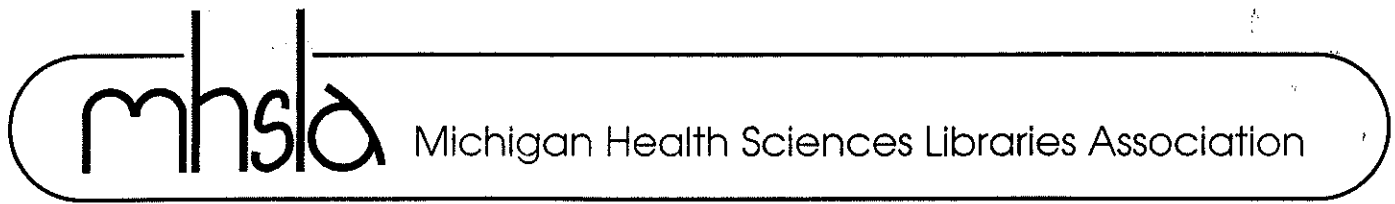

May 25, 1999



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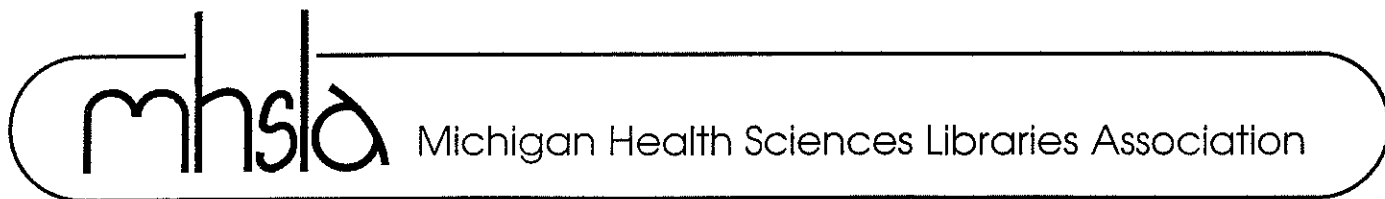
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**MHSLA Archivist

Committee business was conducted by phone, e-mail, and in person.

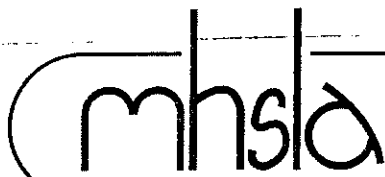
Once again the bylaws were reviewed.

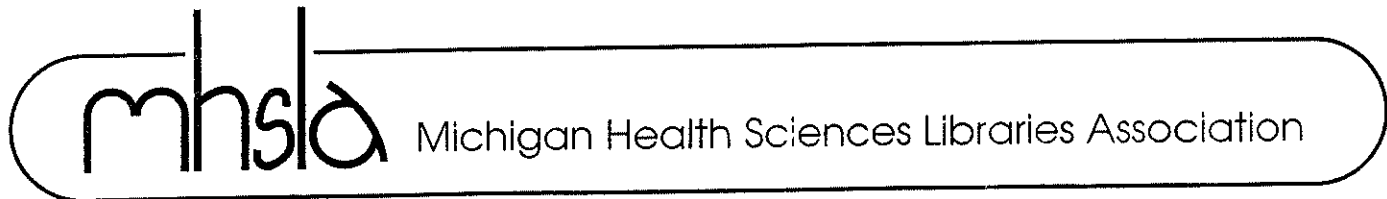

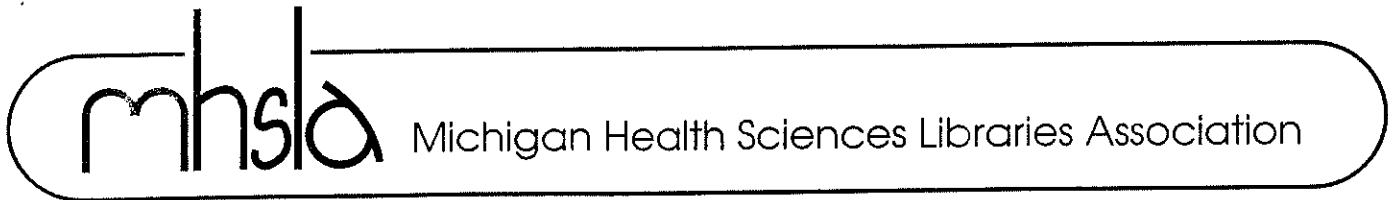

Technology Committee Report
1998/99**

This year the MHSLA Technology Committee put in place the means for MHSLA members to participate in electronic journal clubs. After extensive research and debate, a conferencing software called Web Crossing was selected as the medium for communication for the journal clubs. Web Crossing offers asynchronous communication (journal club members need not all be simultaneously logged on) and archiving of the written conversations which take place among members. The software accommodates many simultaneous e-journal clubs. After an initial free trial of the software, the MHSLA board approved the purchase of the software for the purpose of continuing and expanding the electronic journal clubs. Information on the software and on currently running journal clubs is available through the 'members only' section of the MHSLA web page.

The Technology Committee publicized MHSLA's new technical capability of supporting electronic journal clubs, solicited conveners, and made available the MLA requirements to receive CE credit for e-journal club participation through the MHSLA listserv and the newsletter.

Four journal clubs were convened or are still in the process of convening, and each experienced some success, though complete success (defined as: at least some of the members of an e-journal club receive MLA CE credit for their participation) with a MHSLA electronic journal club is still to be realized. One problem encountered involved the lack of urgency to 'be there' at an appointed time and place; thus sometimes deadlines for comments were not met. The lack of potential for real live argument and the permanence of written comments seemed also to be deterrents to participation. Future plans include developing methods to encourage member participation in spite of these obstacles. 'Chat room'-style, synchronous communication may be attempted just for the spontaneity it allows and encourages. This type of communication was initially rejected by the Technology Committee, because of the difficulty anticipated in getting members logged on simultaneously.

The Technology Committee presented a poster session on its electronic journal club efforts at the annual Medical Library Association conference in Chicago in May. It seemed to spark interest in those attending, and it became clear that it was one of very few electronic journal clubs organized by MLA members.
